Did a salesperson knock on your door and promise free rooftop solar panels at no cost to you? Or say you'll never have to pay another electricity bill because government programs, grants, or rebates cover your solar installation? It's likely a scam. While there are some government-funded solar programs for households that qualify, "going solar" isn't free. Honest ...

This year one of the biggest scams around is the Solar Power System or Solar Panels for Your Home scam. It is part of the home improvement fraud group and is doing its rounds again.

I wanted to get your opinion on the costs with my offer. It is roughly €17.5k for 12 x Evolution UltraMax 370W solar panels giving an output of 4.44kW and a triple power 17.4kW battery storage with a hot water controller. Of course the usual certificates labour etc which they claim is priced at roughly €1.5k. What are your thoughts on this?
